I hope all is well with all in our community of St. Joseph. We have plateaued in the numbers of in-person worshippers. Last week, because of the predicted bad weather, the numbers were lower. We have also seen some people who had returned abstaining from attendance because of the Delta variant. All of us are watching to see what the variant will mean for peoples' confidence about being with others.

As we know, we have divided the pews into "masked" and "unmasked" sections. However, I have heard from several parishioners that they are not comfortable in attending in-person because unmasked individuals are sitting in the masked section. I know that we all like to sit where we have always sat. But, let's be respectful of each other's comfort and safety. Now that we know that vaccinated individuals may be affected by the Delta variant (breakthrough infections), please sit in the appropriate sections. None of us knows whether the person sitting next to us is vaccinated or not. As Christians, we are called to be aware of the fears and concerns of others. One way we can live out this call is to sit in the appropriate section until further notice. I am sure that no one wants to be responsible for causing anxiety or harm to others. Let us all work responsibly to protect each other because we continue to be all in this together.
